

30TH YOUTH CAMP FOR SLOVENIAN CHILDREN FROM ABROAD

CŠOD ŠKORPIJON, JULY 19 - 25, 2026

The Slovenian World Congress will organize 28th Youthcamp for Teenagers of Slovenian Origin from Abroad, from Sunday, July 19, to Saturday, July 25, 2026 in CŠOD Škorpion.

The main purpose of the Youthcamp is to bring Slovenia closer to minds and hearts of youngsters who live abroad. Divided into small groups of six teenagers with one group leader/ animator participants discover the beauty of landscapes and various cultural monuments, culture and national identity of Slovenia, learn and improve their use of Slovenian language. Teenagers with no previous knowledge of Slovenian language are also most welcome to attend the camp.

Making new friendships with peers who share a common bond and come from all around the globe is an adventure and a great life experience.



WHAT ARE THE ACTIVITIES?

- lessons of Slovenian language
- afternoon hikes and workshops
- learning about local traditions
- discovering the Slovenian heritage
- sports, socializing, board games and more!

Participants: the age of participants is limited from 10 to 15 years old. The camp is intended for children who have Slovenian ancestors and live outside the Republic of Slovenia.

Attendance fee per participant is 250 EUR for first applicant, 230 EUR for second and further applicants (valid for family members or group applications) and includes full board (breakfast, lunch and dinner), entrance fees, transportation, workshop materials and accommodation in a youth hostel.

HOW TO REGISTER?

Registration will open on **Sunday, March 9, 2025** at 5:00 p.m. (GMT +1). As the vacancies are limited, attending the camp will be guaranteed upon confirmation of the application by the organizer. Priority will be given to children who have not yet attended the camp and we will also try to ensure an even geographical representation of the participants.
